

# VEGETATION MAINTENANCE

## WE WILL BE WORKING IN YOUR COMMUNITY

March 2019

Hydro One Forestry crews will be conducting routine vegetation maintenance on the high-voltage transmission corridor between Merivale Transformer Station (TS) and South March TS, through the neighbourhoods of Tanglewood, Woodvale, Craig Henry, Manordale and Arlington Woods.

### What is routine vegetation maintenance?

In order to maintain safe clearances from our high-voltage transmission lines and other electrical infrastructure, Hydro One Forestry crews will:

- trim and prune trees;
- remove incompatible vegetation, including trees and brush; and
- apply a low-pressure, low-volume, government approved herbicide directly to cut stems to prevent regrowth. This is **not** a broad-spray application of herbicide.

If work is required on or adjacent to your property, a Hydro One Forestry representative will contact you in advance to discuss the work.

### Why is vegetation maintenance important?

Safety is our top priority. It's our responsibility to ensure that trees and other vegetation remain in a safe proximity to the high-voltage transmission lines and electrical infrastructure in your community, and across the province.
